## WHAT KIND OF EXPERIENCE WAS IT IN THE PAST?

I attended Leadership School in 1998. I am still turning to the resource materials and absorbing the lessons I learned there. Proust once said that great journeys come not from finding new vistas, but by seeing the familiar landscapes with new eyes.

Leadership School gave me more open, informed and insightful eyes when leading my congregation. But, perhaps more importantly, PCDLS taught me I might offer the most by supporting another leader, as well. I learned that my "Lone Ranger" style could unwittingly undermine my efforts with others, my service to my church, and the sense of community I treasured.

You may sign up thinking you are doing Leadership School to be a better church volunteer, but you will soon learn to embrace its lessons for the doors it opens to your soul and your passion and your people. And your eyes will never see more clearly.

Leadership school is a relatively small collection of fellow UU's from Northern California, Northern Nevada and Hawaii, who wish to deepen their understanding of UU faith, help grow their congregation, and better understand what to expect in helping to lead UUs. What you *actually get* from it *DOES* encompass that, tenfold, *PLUS* about a hundred other takeaways you never dreamed of.

I feel like I'm a team player, and also that I'm a strong person. But I was definitely challenged at times. That's the goal. In the setting of Leadership School, you learn **BECAUSE** you are being **ENCOURAGED** – not forced -- to step out of your comfort zone. But true learning and real change has the opportunity to occur when we are rocked to our core. Leadership school is subtle and wise in the way it does this, but it happens.

Now, just because you go to Leadership school doesn't obligate you to a leadership role. I was never pushed, and didn't have any grand plans to LEAD. It was perfectly OK to take it at my own pace, in stages, and when I was comfortable.
